

1-PNR STATUS EXPLAINED

The PNR status of your IRCTC or Indian Railway ticket can easily be checked on our website. Just enter your PNR number and click the button where indicated. A new window will appear showing your current status.

What is PNR status and what does it tell me?




pnr status details : the actual pnr status of the ticket

PNR status is the status of your booking. It tells you whether your ticket is confirmed, wait listed, reserved, etc.

When do I need to know my PNR status?

When traveling by train in India, you may find that your train ticket is on a waitlist. This is quite common and to find out whether your ticket is confirmed you need to check your current *PNR status*. You can easily do this online at www.irctc-pnr-status.com. To see the current status of your train ticket on the IRCTC booking system waitlist, just use the form at the top of this page.

What does "PNR number" mean?



pnr number on Indian Railways ticket

PNR stands for "passenger name record" and it tells you your current status on the WL (waitlist) or RAC (reservation against cancellation queue). If you buy a WL ticket or an RAC ticket, you will be assigned a unique 10-digit PNR number.

3 ways of checking of Indian Railways pnr status

There are three ways to check your PNR status:

- 1. Online via your PC
- 2. Via SMS service
- 3. Via a smartphone app

Online via your PC

The easiest way to check your PNR status is to submit a request on our website www.irctc-pnr-status.com or on official Indian Railways website.

Via SMS service:

Using SMS service Check your PNR status by sending an SMS in one of the following formats:

- your 10-digit PNR number to 139
- your 10-digit PNR number to 5676747

Note: the correct format of the sms text is '9876543210' (sample number – use your unique PNR number). Note that you just need to type your 10-digit PNR number.

Via a smartphone app

Using smartphone apps to check PNR status Internet-connected smartphones and tablets are commonly used so we have listed the following helpful apps for checking your PNR status:


One of the best is "PNR status app", which you can download from the Google Play store.

iPhone app



PNR status and railway reservations explained step by step ... WL and RAC

When all available seats on a train are sold, the railway (Indian Railway or IRCTC) releases RACs for railway reservations. Once all of those are sold, WL tickets are released. On almost every train, tickets are canceled for a variety of reasons. These cancellations can get you on the train if you bought an RAC or WL ticket. When the reservation chart of a particular train is ready (usually meaning that the train is due to depart in a few hours) and there are still some available tickets in different quotas, those will be given to RAC/WL ticket holders.

Here is an example of a railway reservation situation. Tickets are sold in the following order:

- 1. Available 02
- 2. Available 01
- 3. RAC 01
- 4. RAC 02
- 5. RAC 03
- 6. RAC 04
- 7. WL 01

8. WL 02

Understanding your ticket and WL number of PNR status

On your ticket, there are two numbers. They tell you the position at which you joined the

waitlist and your current position – in this order. Here is an example:

You are booking a ticket online (Indian Railway, IRCTC, etc...). You find the train and

class/seat/berth that you want along with the date and time. At the end of the

reservation, you buy a ticket with WL5/WL2.

In this example you joined the WL at position 5, but by the time you actually bought the

ticket online you moved to position 2 (due either to a cancellation or to someone not

making a final booking). The first number will stay the same – it indicates when you

JOINED the queue. The second number will decrease until you get a ticket (hopefully).

Your railway reservation could look like:

• WL 5/WL 2 (this is your starting position)

WL 5/WL 1

WL 5/RAC 3

WL 5/RAC 2

WL 5/RAC 1

WL 5/CNF

WL 5/WL 2 = Waitlist ticket: you cannot board the train.

WL 5/RAC 3 = RAC ticket: you are allowed to board the train, but you may end up on a seat instead of a berth.

WL 5/CNF = Confirmed ticket: you can board the train and you have a berth to yourself.

WL and RAC refunds

If your train is ready for departure and its reservation chart is finalized, the cost of your WL ticket will be automatically refunded to your bank account.

NOTE: There can be significant movement on the waitlist on the very last day, so you may get an RAC status at the last minute. In such a case, you will not get a refund, as an RAC is actually a boarding ticket.

2-BOOKING EXPLAINED

Booking guide

If you plan to book a ticket for an Indian Railway train, do it soon. It doesn't really matter where and how you do it, but if you want to be sure you get a ticket there is no better advice than to plan your journey in advance and make the reservation as soon as possible – this means the very first day the train tickets are being sold.

Booking at the railway station

You need to find the nearest train station, fill in the relevant form and wait in a queue. As these queues tend to be very long, we recommend that you make the reservation online. If you have no option but to book your ticket in person, here is the list of all railway stations in India

Last-minute booking

If for any reason you do not have a ticket and your journey is just a few days away, there still is a chance to get one. This option is called Tatkal ticket and here is the Tatkal booking.

3-HOW WL POSITION IMPROVES

Is my RAC or WL position likely to improve? When?

WL and RAC positions always improve, but this depends on a number of factors. The main factor is how far in advance you booked your ticket. Later we will tell you how to see if it is even possible to become confirmed if you have a WL position.

Here are the top 3 ways a WL/RAC ticket position can improve:

Many tickets are cancelled due to the fact that the cancellation fee is very low. For this reason, people who are not 100% certain when they are traveling will book a number of tickets for one itinerary and then later, when they have decided exactly which train to take, they cancel the rest. This is when your ticket improves its position.

- All trains eligible for online reservations have different quotas; these seats are reserved for various people – government employees, military employees, rail employees, the handicapped and a few others. Often these tickets are not sold and this is another reason why a WL position can improve.
- 2. Ticket holders can upgrade free of charge to a higher class (up to two classes higher than originally booked). When the final reservation chart is calculated and there are available seats in the higher classes, passengers may move to those classes, making their original seats available.

Exception: During Indian holidays, all trains in general, and some busy trains in particular, can be sold out virtually within a minute after they are released for online booking. On those trains, the wait lists are very long and the chance of getting a confirmed ticket is low.

Can I check if my WL position has improved? PNR status check.

Along with your ticket, you receive a unique PNR number. This is printed on the upper right corner of your ticket and contains 10 digits. You use this PNR number to check your current status.

4-PNR NUMBER EXPLAINED

PNR number explained

The PNR number (passenger name record) is a 10-digit number printed on the upper right corner of your Indian Railway ticket. (It used to be divided into 2 parts, 3+7 digits, but no longer...)

This PNR number gives you the ability to check your PNR status online.

There are five main items of information that will be printed on your issued ticket:

- 1. Passenger name
- 2. Travel agent details
- 3. Ticket details ticket number
- 4. Itinerary

5. Name of the person booking the ticket
